And for now stay home, stay safe.

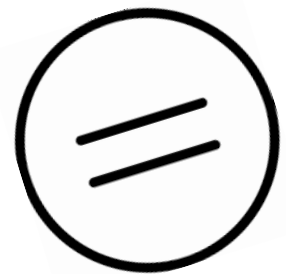

Find two landmarks in Tenby are named after Viking words (Norse?)

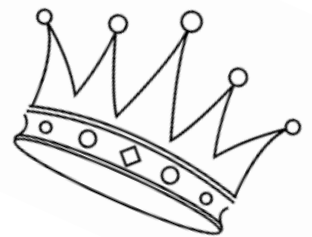

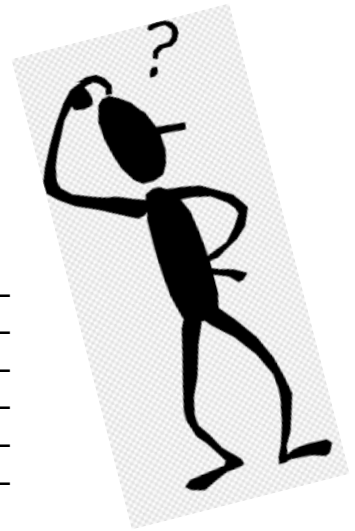
